THE STRUCTURE OF THE NATIONS

Revelation 5:9 allows us to view a divine snapshot of who will be gathered around God's throne worshipping Him. This peek reveals a rather colorful and varied redeemed group "from every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation."

What do you think of when you hear the word "nations?" Most of us envision geopolitical boundaries on a brightly colored map. These lessons give us a proper view of the word "nations" in the Bible. Understanding this term allows us to see God's plan in accomplishing worship as the end goal as seen in Revelation 5:9.

 - c. Moses was given the Law: Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 10.
 - d. Joshua was given the Land: Joshua 1:1-9.
- 2. *"I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing;"* (Genesis 12:2)
- 3. *"I will bless them that bless thee and curse them that curse thee: and in thee shall all the families of the earth be blessed."* (Genesis 12:3)

B. A _____ *"...in thee shall all families (nations, clans, ethnos) of the earth be blessed"* (Genesis 12:3)

- 1. God blessed Abraham to be a blessing.
- 2. God desires that *"all families"* (ethnos, people groups) acknowledge Him and bow before Him (Genesis 12:3-4).
- 3. The promise given to Abraham gives the mission of the church a people group focus.
